## Despite some differences, all four structures have a number of common functions

- 1. Administrative Director
- 2. Management group composed of administrative personnel and faculty responsible for day-to-day operations and administrative decisions
- 3. Pedagogical group comprised of elected or self-selected faculty
  - Decision making authority varies
  - Generally responsible for decisions related to pedagogical issues, curriculum, hiring and firing of faculty
  - 3 out of 4 have Pedagogical Chair positions
- 4. Multiple committees responsible for various functions
  - Decision making authority at the committee level varies
